To Town of Hudson Mayoral and Trustee Candidates:

The enclosed materials have been prepared by the Hudson Town Clerk's Office for use by Mayoral and Trustee candidates in the Town of Hudson regular municipal election, which will be held **Tuesday, April 6, 2010**. Included are a summary of the basic requirements associated with the election, a listing of critical election dates and all forms required for the election.

The Town of Hudson's regular municipal election will be conducted as a mail ballot election. The mail ballots will be mailed to registered voters March 15<sup>th</sup> through March 18<sup>th</sup> 2010. The Hudson Town Hall will be a drop-off location for mail ballots and will be open on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Ballots must be received at the Hudson Town Hall on or before 7:00 p.m. on April 6, 2010 to be counted for the election. The ballot will ask voters to consider candidates for the Mayoral position as well as four Trustee positions.

Nomination Petitions will be available at the Hudson Town Hall on Friday, February 12, 2010; however, Nomination Petitions cannot be circulated until February 15, 2010. A minimum of ten signatures from registered voters residing within the Town limits is required in order to establish candidacy. Completed Nomination Petitions, along with signed Affidavit of Circulator form and a Notice of Intent to be a Candidate for Municipal Office forms are due in my office on Friday, March 5, 2010 by 5:00 p.m. A drawing by lot will be held in the Hudson Town Hall at 9:30 a.m. on Monday, March 8, 2010. The drawing will determine the order candidates will be listed on the official ballot.

Candidate's must comply with the Fair Campaign Practices Act's reporting requirements which stipulate that the necessary forms be filed in the office of the Hudson Town Clerk, deadlines for these documents are listed on the election calendar.

Candidates are welcome to display campaign signs on private property with the owner's permission. However, signs on public streets, parks, light poles, traffic signs, etc. are illegal and will be removed by Town personnel. We also ask that candidates remove their signs after the election.
