Hunter Fobare, Public Works, and Utilities Director presented on the costs associated with snowplowing and how the procedures for storm events work.

6) GENERAL BUSINESS

- a. **RESOLUTION 21-8: A RESOLUTION APPROVING A LICENSE AGREEMENT ALLOWING HUDSON HILLS HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION USE OF TOWN PROPERTY FOR A MONUMENT SIGN.**

Jennifer Woods, Town Planner, reported that this is for a sign identifying the neighborhood.

Jay Hirokawa, Police Chief, reported that he wants to make sure everyone is watching their calls because there have been 3800 stolen cars in 2021 so far.

Sarah Stadler, Councilmember, reported that she met with Police Chief Jay Hirokawa and will have a presentation for the next meeting.


