**b. RESOLUTION NO. 20-07: A RESOLUTION APPROVING PANDEMIC HARDSHIP RELIEF TO CITIZENS OF THE TOWN OF HUDSON**

Guy Patterson, Town Manager, reported that this started as memo from the Mayor, Attorney and the Clerk. Since the Town can't help with taxes, we can provide relief with our enterprise funds. This will include waiving late fees, providing relief for those who have lost employment, and business activities.

Councilmember Nolf made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Hammock to approve Resolution No 20-07, a resolution approving pandemic hardship relief to citizens of the Town of Hudson.

**3) STAFF REPORTS**

Guy Patterson, Town Manager, reported that there was a public works employee that was symptomatic. His test did come back negative. The Town Website has added an information page for business and information about the virus. The Town Finances, the sales tax is going to be a big issues in the next six months. He modeled what 30% below last years. Was. He reported in the general fund we will be about 90k short. Our biggest outlay is the Loyd land metro district. The sales tax capital fund will take a kit of 31k. The paving sales tax fund will take a 115k hit on, but the Town can still do what has been budgeted. It's a best guess estimate with sales tax.

Charity Campfield, Town Clerk, reported that they will be waiving late fees because of the Town Hall being shut down. Bills will be sent out normally but there will be no shutoffs this month either. She is still depositing money and focusing on water bills, payroll, AR and AP.

Hunter Fobare, Public Works and Utilities Director, reported that his crew is prepared for the storm coming in. His water and sewer crew are still working and keeping things maintained.

Jay Hirokawa, Police Chief, reported that his officers are taking care of their equipment and their calls. They are on indefinite accident alert.

Laura Hargis, Mayor, reported that she would like to suggest closing the parks.

It was decided to put informational signs out at the park that they virus can be on the park equipment as well as posting it on the Facebook page.
