2) **GENERAL BUSINESS**

a. **DISCUSSION: HUDSON POLICE DEPARTMENT FY-2021 PROPOSED COMPENSATION**

Council discussed possible alternatives to what was proposed in the Budget for the fiscal year 2021 Police Compensation and departmental requirements.

b. **DISCUSSION: HUDSON FEES**

Guy Patterson, Town Manager, reported on the fee changes that will be incorporated into the 2021 budget.

c. **RESOLUTION 20-29: A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT AMONG THE TOWN OF HUDSON, THE HUDSON PUBLIC LIBRARY, AND THE TOWN OF KEENESBURG ESTABLISHING THE KEENESBURG LIBRARY**

Guy Patterson, Town Manager, reported that the Hudson Public Library is adding a brick and mortar library in the Town of Keenesburg. The Hudson Library Board approved the agreement earlier this evening.

Councilmember Chavez made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Maestas to approve Resolution No. 20-29: a resolution approving an intergovernmental agreement among the Town of Hudson, The Hudson Public Library, and the Town of Keenesburg establishing the Keenesburg Library.

d. **ORDINANCE NO 20-05: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 16, ARTICLE 4, OF THE HUDSON MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO SETBACK REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCESSORY STRUCTURES IN RESIDENTIAL ZONES, FIRST READING.**

Jennifer Woods, Town Planner, reported that this amendment will change the setbacks for accessory structures and what the new setback requirements will be.

Councilmember Nolf made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Chavez to approve Ordinance No 20-05: An Ordinance amending Chapter 16, Article 4, of the Hudson Municipal code relating to setback requirements for accessory structures in residential zones, first reading.

The vote was as follows:

Aye: Councilmembers Stadler, Nolf, Maestas, Hammock, Chavez and Mayor Hargis.

Mayor Hargis declared the motion carried.

- e. **ORDINANCE NO 20-03: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 7-10 OF THE HUDSON MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO BURNING OF GARBAGE AND WASTE MATERIALS. SECOND READING.**

Charity Campfield, Town Clerk, reported that this is the second reading to this ordinance she presented on November 4, 2020 and nothing has changed.

Councilmember Nolf made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Chavez to approve Ordinance No 20-03: An Ordinance amending section 7-10 of the Hudson Municipal code relating to burning of garbage and waste materials. Second reading.

The vote was as follows:

- f. **ORDINANCE NO 20-04: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 4 OF CHAPTER 6 OF THE HUDSON MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO LIQUOR CODE VIOLATION PENALTIES. FIRST READING.**

Charity Campfield, Town Clerk, reported that this is the second reading to this ordinance she presented on November 4, 2020 and nothing has changed.

Councilmember Chavez made a motion, seconded by Councilmembers Hammock to approve Ordinance No 20-24: An Ordinance amending article 4 of Chapters 6 of the Hudson Municipal Code relating to Liquor Code violation penalties. First reading.

3) STAFF REPORTS

Guy Patterson, Town Manager, reported that he has put the Town Hall staff back at 50%.

Corey Hoffmann, Town Attorney, asked for input on the judge applications and are extending the deadline to get them back to the Town Manager. He asked about the fee in lieu the school district requested and if the council wants to pursue it.

Jay Hirokawa, Police Chief, reported that there have been some accidents with the I-76 project and the barrels out on the interstate. They have had 328 incidents on the project since July.

Hunter Fobare, Public Works and Utilities Director, reported that they have completed the irrigation on the Cedar Park and the grey barn will be going down next month. They are preparing to get the Christmas lights up.

Maria Chavez, Councilmember, asked about having a virtual Town Hall Christmas Lighting.

Laura Hargis, Mayor, asked about the Town Christmas Party.

4) CITIZEN'S COMMENTS

Celinda Haynes, 745 Ash Street, discussed her concerns with the money budgeted for the police department.
