

ORDINANCE NO. 15

TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUING OF LICENSES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF HUDSON STATE OF COLORADO.

ARTICLE ONE

SECTION 1. That it shall be unswfull for any person or persons to exhibit for gain within the limits of the Town, any animal or animals, wax or other figures, or paintings, feats or circus-riding, rope or wire dancing sleifht of hand, or any theatrical or musical entertainment; oor to keep or maintain within the limits of the town for, gain, any skating rink, shooting gallery, billard table, bagatelle, or pigeon-hole table, or bowling alley; or to pursue the avocation of hawker, peddler, pawn-broker, or auctioner, within the limits of this town, without first having obtained license or permit therefor; and if any person so licensed shall violate any or the provisions of this ordinance, he shall be liable to be proceeded against for the penalty or fine imposed thusly; and his license or permit be revoked by the Mayor of the Town.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the Mayor to gfant the licenses or permits herein provided for; if in his oginion the exhibition will not injurously effect the morols of the people or offend against the rules of decency and good order; and he shall, in his discretion, fix the sum to be paid for licenses or permits, in all cases not herein provided for.

SECTION 3. All licenses or permits shall be issued and signed by the Town Cler, pursuant to the order of the Mayor, upon payment to him of the sum assessed therefor; and no person shall have authority to act, exhibit or perform, until the license or permit is duly secured.

SECTION 4. No license or permit granted under this ordinance shall be assignable or transferable without the written permission of the Mayor. and shall not be franted for a period longer than to the annual town election on the first Tuesday in April thereafter.

SECTION 5. The Town Clerk shall keep a license register, in which shall be entered the name of each and every person licensed, pursuant to this ordinance, the date of the license, the purpose for which granted, the amount paid therefor, and the time the same will expire or continue in force; and all permits issued under this ordinance shall be record.d in like manner.

ARTICLE TWO

SECTION 1. Any person who shall sell or attempt to sell any goods, chattels, or property whatever, at public auction, or by hawking or peddling within this town, without first obtaining a license or permit therefor, as hereinafter provided shall forfeit and pay to the town, for each offense, a sum not less than five (5) dollars nor than twenty-five (25) dollars and costs of suit.

SECTION 2. All sales made at public suction, under and by virtue of legal proceedings, or the hawking of peddling of produce by persons raising or porducing the same, shall be exempt from the provisions of this article.

SECTION 3. All sales of goods, wares, merchandise, by or in the interest of transient merchants, or non-resident auctioners, shall be subject to a special permit and the sum therfor shall be fixed by the Mayor.

ARTICLE

ARTICLE THREE

BILLARD, BAGATELLE, OR PIGEON-HOLE TABLES, AND BOWLING ALLEYS.

SECTION 1. The license for one billard table, ~~one~~ bagatelle or pigeon-hole table, or bowling alley shall be Five Dollars, and for each additional table or alley Two Dollars and Fifty cents for one year or fraction thereof. It shall be at the discretion of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hudson, to grant or reject any application for license, as aforesaid, and no license shall be granted or issued for a shorter period of time than from the time of issuance to the next annual town election on the first Tuesday in April thereafter, nor until the application shall have deposited with the Town Clerk a good and sufficient bond to the town, in the penal sum of \$ _____ with at least two sureties, to be approved by the Board of Trustees, conditioned that the party so licensed will not permit any game to be played in or about his premises where such tables or bowling alleys are situated, for money, or other articles of value, and that he will not keep his establishment open on Sunday, nor allow any playing on said tables, or bowling upon said alleys, except between the hours of six o'clock A. M. and Twelve o'clock at midnight.

SECTION 2. Any person to whom a license shall have been granted according to the provisions of this article, who shall permit any minor to frequent the room where such billard table, bagatelle, or pigeon-hole table, or bowling alley is kept, or to participate or play in any game played upon such tables or in such bowling alley, unless such minor is accompanied by either one of his parents or his guardian; or who shall place any certain or screen across the windows or in front of such tables in such a manner as to obstruct a full view of the interior of such room, from the public street, shall, upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum of not less than five dollars not more than Three hundred dollars and costs, and his license shall be revoked.

SECTION 3. Any person who shall keep any billard tables, bagatelle or pigeon-hole tables or bowling alleys, for use, with the meaning of this article within this town, without first having obtained a license therefore, as required by this article, shall forfeit and pay to the said town, the sum of three hundred dollars and costs of suit, for each offense, and in default of payment, way be imprisoned in the Town Jail, no to exceed ninety days, at the discretion of the court.

ARTICLE FOUR

SECTION 1. Any person or persons who shall exhibit conduct, or manage for gain, within this town any theater, circus, caravan, or other exhibitions, or other show, or amusement, or who shall exhibit any unnatural or artificial curiosities, or device of any kind, or shall give any concert or musical entertainment, with first having obtained a license or permit therefore, as hereinafter provided; shall forfeit and pay to the Town for each offense, a sum of not less than Twenty five dollars, not more than Fifty dollars and costs of the suit; provided, that for dramatic or musical entertainment, and all exhibitions given or made by the citizens of this town, no license shall be required.

SECTION 2. The Town Clerk, in issuing any license, or permit granted under the provisions of this article, shall specify therein the objects and length of time for which the same is granted, and the

peace where the exhibition, of performance is to be.
