ORDINANCE NO. 29

An Ordinance Vacating the South One-Hundred Fifty-Nine Feet of the Alley in Block Thirty-Four, Town of Hudson, Colorado, in Consideration of Dedication of a New Alley East and West through said Block by Foster Lumber Company.

WHEREAS, Foster Lumber Company has agreed that in consideration that the South 159 feet of the alley running North and South through Block Thirty-Four, Town of Hudson, be vacated, said company will forthwith open and dedicate an alley running East and West through said block along the north side of Lots Ten and Twenty-Six in said Block;

AND WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of said town do now deem it proper to proceed to accept said proposition,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hudson, Colorado:

Section 1. That the South One-Hundred Fifty-Nine Feet of the alley in Block Thirty-Four, Town of Hudson, be and the same is hereby vacated, in consideration of the granting by Foster Lumber Company of an alley sixteen feet in width east and west through said block, being the North Sixteen Feet of Lots Ten and Twenty-Six in said block.
