TITLE: AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 19-01, SERIES OF 2019, AND CREATING ARTICLE 19 OF CHAPTER 2 OF THE HUDSON MUNICIPAL CODE TO ESTABLISH THE HUDSON RECREATION COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 19-01, Series of 2019, adopted on first reading on December 5, 2018, erroneously attempted to establish the Hudson Recreation Committee at Article 18, Chapter 2, of the Hudson Municipal Code;

WHEREAS, Article 18, Chapter 2, of the Hudson Municipal Code already exists and establishes the Department of Public Safety;

WHEREAS, Town Council wishes to repeal Ordinance No. 19-01, Series of 2019, and to relocate the Recreation Committee provisions to a new Article 19, Chapter 2, of the Hudson Municipal Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL FOR THE TOWN OF HUDSON, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 19-01, Series of 2019, attempting to establish the Hudson Recreation Committee at Article 18, Chapter 2, of the Hudson Municipal Code, is repealed in its entirety.

Section 2. Article 18, Chapter 2, of the Hudson Municipal Code, regarding the Department of Public Safety, as last revised by Ordinance No. 16-11, remains unchanged.

Section 3. The Hudson Municipal Code is amended by the addition of a new Article 19, Chapter 2, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 19

Hudson Recreation Committee

Sec. 2-250. Creation; membership

(a) Pursuant to Section 5.02 of the Town of Hudson Home Rule Charter, there is hereby created the Hudson Recreation Committee, as an advisory Committee to the Town Council.

(b) The Committee will consist of five (5) members, all of whom shall be appointed by the Town Council. At least one (1) member of the Committee shall be a member of the Town Council.

(c) Members of the Committee shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years.

(d) Members of the Committee may hold other municipal offices.

Sec. 2-251. Meetings

(a) Meetings shall be held on at least a semi-annual basis, at a time agreed upon by the members of the Committee.

(b) A quorum shall consist of at least three (3) members of the Committee.

Sec. 2-252. Vacancies and removal

(a) A vacancy on the Committee shall exist upon the resignation, death or removal of any member, or upon the termination of the term of any member of the Committee.

(b) Any vacancy on the Committee shall be filled in the manner provided by section 2-250 above.

(c) Citizen members of the Committee may be removed by the Town Council after public hearing for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance of office. Such public hearing shall be held only after the filing by the Mayor of written charges and upon proper notice.

Sec. 2-253. Organization and rules

(a) The Committee shall select its chairman from among the members for a term of one (1) year.

(b) The Committee shall keep minutes of its meetings.

(c) The Committee shall adopt rules for the transaction of business. Except as otherwise provided by ordinance, the proceedings and meetings of the Committee shall be governed by such rules.

Sec. 2-254. Duties and Authority.

The Committee shall have the following duties and authority:

(a) To be an advisory Committee to the Town Council;

(b) To assist and advise the Town Council in the formulation of short-term and long-range plans for parks, recreation facilities and recreation programs;

(c) To assist and advise the Town Council in the budget review process, with reference to the Town's parks and recreation budget;

(d) To assist and advise the Town Council in determining the community's needs and desires for parks, programs, and facilities on an annual basis; and

(e) To do evaluations of recreation programs following each seasonal program period and advise the Town Council on changes that should be made.


Section 4. Safety Clause. The Town Council hereby finds, determines, and declares that this Ordinance is promulgated under the general police power of the Town of Hudson, that it is promulgated for the health, safety, and welfare of the public, and that this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and safety and for the protection of public convenience and welfare. The Council further determines that the Ordinance bears a rational relation to the proper legislative object sought to be attained.

Section 5. Severability. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall for any reason be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction invalid, such judgment shall not affect application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after final publication by title only.


